Nichols, Ph.D., DABCC, FAACC is currently a Professor of Pathology, Microbiology and Immunology at the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine and Medical Director of Clinical Chemistry and Point-of-Care Testing for the Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville, Tennessee, USA. Dr. Nichols has held several leadership positions with the American Association for Clinical Chemistry (AACC), the AACC Academy (formerly NACB), and he is currently on the Board of Directors and Chair of the Evaluations Protocols Expert Panel for the Clinical and Laboratory Standards Institute (CLSI). Dr. Nichols' research interests span evidence-based medicine, information management, laboratory automation, point-of-care testing and clinical toxicology.
